Message from the President... Every Day, In Every Way, It's Getting Better and Better (repeat)

Finally, it has started. The city and utility contractors are busy digging up the north-east corner of Windsor Park, and, over the next two years, will work their way through our soon-to-be-even-lovelier neighbourhood, replacing sidewalks and light standards, and otherwise rehabilitating infrastructure. After that, they have promised not to return for another sixty years. Whew!

Infrastructure Consultation Updates

The city's plans for infrastructure redevelopment gave rise to a number of contentious issues requiring further consultation with affected residents and the city:

Saskatchewan Drive between 118th and 116th Streets will be come a one-way, east-bound roadway and left-turns to, and right turns from, Emily Murphy Hill will be banned. The main reason for the change is the fact that the present intersection does not meet current standards. At the same time, the roadway will be narrowed, from 11823 Saskatchewan Drive east, to reduce the potential impacts on existing trees and landscaping arising from the installation of a multi-use trail along the drive. My thanks to the residents of this block for their patience and help while we worked to find an acceptable compromise.

The city has agreed not to construct a sidewalk on Edinboro Road between 118th Street and 93rd Avenue, if that is what the residents therein request. The

city now agrees with the league that this is not an essential sidewalk and that the sidewalks on 93rd Avenue and 118th Street serve as a through-route.

The city will be adding some parking spaces on 92nd, 91st and 89th avenues. These new parking spaces have not been greeted with unalloyed joy, but the league and city both agree it is a reasonable compromise to help offset the complete loss of parking on 116 Street due to the installation of new bike lanes.

Break-ins and Thefts

After March's spate of break-ins and thefts, it is once again quiet in our neighbourhood. The two arrests seem to have done the job. Our thanks go out to everyone who kept their eyes open and the police lines humming. Don't stop now! Report any suspicious activity to the police non-emergency line at 780.423.4567.

Park Re-Development Update

The end of the school year will be the start of phase two of our park redevelopment. This will see the construction of a shelter, teaching area, granular paths through to the north park and back, sledding hill next to the basketball courts and the rehabilitation and realignment of the soccer fields to meet current standards. Thankfully, our new playground will remain open, and there will be a city-run, "green shack" program for children during the summer.

Even more exciting news is that we have been approved for the city's portion of funding for a spray deck in 2013! I double-checked, and it is indeed legal for older people, such as myself, to scamper through a spray deck, too!

Summer Sizzler and Park Celebration

This year, we will not be holding a summer sizzler in June. Instead, we will be

having a celebration on a Saturday afternoon in early September to open phase two of our park redevelopment. Watch your mailboxes toward the middle of August for more details. Come on out to meet your neighbours and enjoy the new park features.
